
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Year 4 Trip to the Gurdwara

At the end of the assembly, Roger treated us by singing one of his own songs to us. The song was one of his own most famous songs called 'Huddersfield Town'.


The choir also sang to say thank you to Roger Davies for coming to visit our school.




Year 2 : Tropical World









WOOD- HOUSE LUNCH TIME

On Wednesday 6th March, the whole school voted in the school council election. I interviewed one of the new Year Six councillors. Here's what they said...


How did you feel when you got school council?
