

WOODHOUSE PRIMARY SCHOOL

SPORT DEVELOPMENT / PE ACTION PLAN 2020-21

with sports funding allocation (£19600 and £3,135 carried forward from 2019-20)

September 2021: This is a working document and will be amended as sporting provision is adapted and adjusted throughout the year.

The aim of this document is to:

- develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For 2019-20, the total expenditure was £16,465 and therefore, £3,135 will be carried forward into this academic year (2020-21).

As a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, the Department for Education has taken steps to relax the ring-fencing arrangements for the PE and sport premium in the 2019-20 and 2020-21 academic years to allow any unspent grant to be carried forward into the next academic year (2021 to 2022). At Woodhouse, any under-spends (£3,135) will be carried forward into the Sport Development / PE Action Plan 2021-22 and will be spent in full by 31 July 2022 in line with the DfE guidance.

For 2020-21, the total expenditure was £16,450.81 and therefore, £6,284.19 will be carried forward into the next academic year (2021-22).
