Each year group now has a blog on Purple Mash. These can be accessed by clicking on the green Sharing world.




Sharing

## RE

Ask your child to think about all of the groups that they belong to - sports clubs, activity clubs, after school clubs, religious groups, the Woodhouse School family, your family. Encourage them to make a plan for how they will celebrate when they get to go back to these groups and see all their friends and family again. Will they have a party? If so, what food would they eat, what games will they play? What will they wear? What music will they listen to?

If you can, put the music on that they chose and make up a new dance routine together. You could pretend you're having a party lunch or tea - lay out a blanket, get their favourite toys involved and have a carpet picnic! Or for older children, let them create a party play list and play 'Guess the Song' - you let them listen to the first 10 seconds and they have to guess what song it is.

## PE

Outside: Encourage your child to create an obstacle course in your garden and time them to complete it.

Can they improve on their time every day?

Inside: Try a Cosmic Kids Yoga session on YouTube or create your own family yoga moves. Spend some time at the end of every day just sitting, breathing deeply and reflecting on what has gone well that day and what you'd all like to do the following day.

## Reading

Just read for pleasure. Choose your favourite books and share them. Make time to read as a family - in a normal week there often isn't time for this. Choose a book and read a page each or for younger children, get them to spot words that they know. Use different voices for characters. Choose a fiction book (a story) and then choose a non-fiction book and use the contents and index page to find specific information. Make a den and read in the den together or for older children encourage them to recommend their favourite books to their friends on Purple Mash.

## Writing

Keep a diary, one that you can keep in a safe place and read in the future to remind yourselves of how the world stayed home to keep everyone safe.



## Maths

Play the 'Yes/No Game':

How to play:

Step 1: Both players put a card on their head. It could have a number on it, a shape etc....

Step 2: The first player asks a question which can only be answered with 'yes' or 'no'. E.g. 'Am I odd?' 'Am I under 20?' 'Do I have 4 sides?' etc.....

Step 3: They keep asking questions until they get the answer correct, or they run out of turns (you can set the number of turns they get at the beginning of the game). Then it is time for the other player to have a go.
