

Science

We have uploaded a Wimbledon Power Point and some Wimbledon Reading Comprehension activities for you.




Watch the video on the school website that explains how you can access 'Serial Mash.' Serial Mash is a library on Purple Mash that has lots of activities for you to complete.

Planned Play

We have added this section for children in Reception and Y1 who may need to do more of their learning through play-based activities. However, children of any age may enjoy them too!

This week's Planned Play is all about rhyming! Watch the video of Mrs Hirst reading a rhyming book to Marty the monkey. Then find as many books as you can from around your house that have rhyming words in them. Julia Donaldson often uses rhyme in her stories.

You will need:

- Paper or a notepad
- Different coloured pens

The set up:

- With your child write the alphabet in one colour going down the page. Then choose a 3 letter word that is easy to rhyme with e.g. bat or pen. Using another colour add the end of the word (the rhyme) to each letter of the alphabet that makes a real word. You could also make some funny alien words too!



Additional ideas to keep the play going:

- Draw a little picture to go with the words
- Find as many of the items around your house
- Play a rhyming game - one person starts by choosing a word and then you take it in turns rhyming with that word. The winner is the person who can keep adding new words
