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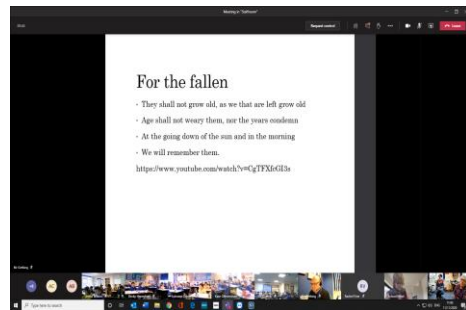
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Remembrance Assembly – Wed 11 November 2020

Year 5 & 6 Anxiety workshops

We have organised for Open Minds Calderdale (CAMHS) to deliver an hour long, interactive, live zoom session for our pupils in Years 5 and 6.

The session will be led by a Mental Health practitioner who will discuss anxiety, what it feels like, why our body displays anxiety and strategies to help overcome or minimise anxiety. These whole class sessions will take place for Year 5 on 17th November and for Year 6 on 24th November.
