

SCHOOL RULES:

We have linked our own **School Values** to the rules that have been decided by pupils and staff

BE SAFE:

- I should tell a member of staff if I see a visitor who isn't wearing a name badge.
- I will never open an outside door once they have been closed.
- I will always walk around school sensibly and quietly.
- I will play appropriately in the play areas.
- I will always line up sensibly when it is time.

KS2

- I will only place appropriate items in my locker/bag and will only go into someone else's locker when I have permission.

BE CARING:

BE HEALTHY/SAFE

Football / Ball Games

- I will respect others when playing with a ball.
- If I accidentally hurt someone else whilst playing, I will check they are OK and help to pick them up.
- I will only play football when it's my year group's turn.
- I will not play with a ball before / after school.


KS2 Adventure Trail

Running Track / Field

- I will help to keep the running track safe
 - by running in the right direction
 - by running on the left / walking on the right
 - by not eating whilst running
- When the running track and field are both in use, I will keep obstructions **off** the track.

School opening (various times):

Each year group has a designated 10 minute arrival time where parents will drop off their children at the school gate. Teaching staff are available to welcome pupils onto the school grounds where they are expected to line up on the bubbles in the playground. You will need to walk into school sensibly and put your coat and bag in the cloakroom or locker. Lessons start once all the bubble has arrived. Your teacher will take the register whilst you complete a morning work task - on completion read silently.

Playtime (various times):

- There are at least two adults on duty each playtime.
- Each day you will be told by the person on duty where you can play.
- Equipment is provided for playtime.
- If you hurt yourself, don't go into school on your own. One of the adults will see to you and apply first aid as necessary.
- At the end of playtime, you will be asked to line up sensibly and you are expected to walk into class silently as other year groups will still be working.
- If you want to bring tuck to school, you can bring fruit or vegetables, as these are a healthy alternative to sweets and crisps. **(No nuts)**.

Dinner time (various times):

At lunchtime, each class is allocated a midday supervisor. If you have any problems at lunchtime, please speak to the supervisor responsible for your class.

Classwork and Homework:

Your exercise books are labelled. Under no circumstances should you mark the covers. You will be given a homework diary in which to record homework and make a note of messages or reminders. Spelling will be given out once a week and will be tested the following week. Homework will be given on Friday and be marked the following week.

PE:

For PE, you will need to bring a pump bag with shorts, a T-shirt and pumps all labelled with your name. For outdoor games, you will be asked to bring a sweatshirt and trainers. Pupils are expected to remove their own studs for PE. Children with hair longer than shoulder length should have it tied back.

Class Council:

In September and February each year, you will elect two pupils as Class Councillors. These pupils will represent you at School Council.

Well-Done Book:

Each week, a small number of pupils are recorded in the well done book for special work or effort and will be praised in class reflection time and a post card will be sent home.

Classroom Equipment:

You are encouraged to bring your own pencil case into school from Year 2 onwards. Blue rollerball pens are acceptable to use once you have received your pen license in Year 4 or Year 5 although school handwriting pens are preferred. Tippex / eraser pens are not allowed. Pupils should not write in biro unless using the green editing pens. You should not wear jewellery or wrist bands although simple watches may be worn. Pierced earrings should be limited to one pair of studs.

GR8 Learners' Points:

GR8 Learner points will be awarded to you when you are seen to be achieving one of the eight skills. At the end of each half term, you will then reflect on your skill set and decide on your area of success and choose an area for improvement. Certificates will be presented alongside a chance for your name to be entered into the GR8 Learner raffle. Good Luck!

Reading:

Reading is so important at our school and as well as the school reading scheme there are other books and resources that you can access to improve your reading skills. The school reading journals help parents and teachers keep track of the amount of reading you are completing – don't forget to fill them in! You can also begin to complete the all-new 50 Book Challenge which can be found in your reading journals. This contains a variety of amazing books perfect for your age-group. The challenge is: how many can you complete?

Computing:

There are a huge range of online resources that are available to us as a school. You can set your own challenges and learning on Purple Mash; you can improve your times tables on TT Rockstars if you're in KS2; or if you're in Year Six, you can even use Accelerated Reader to quiz on the books you have read!

Home-learning:

Should you be awaiting the results of a COVID test from someone within your household, you should look in your homework diary and complete some of the challenges from the 'If I'm at Home' Pupil Guide.

If your class or year group has been closed, remember to log into Purple Mash and go on 2Email where you will find instructions for your daily learning. If you need any help, you will be able to discuss your learning with an adult during an online Microsoft Teams meeting.
