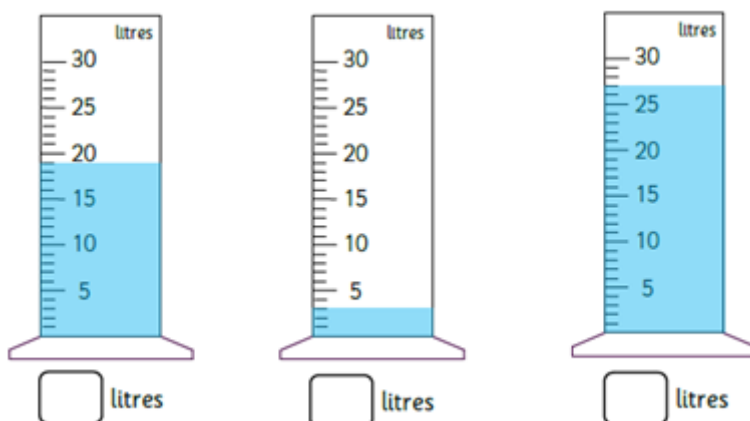


Dear Parent/Carers,

We used atlases to find the features and locate them on a map of the United Kingdom. We also learnt how to use Google Maps as a 'modern' atlas!
