Classroom News

Year 4 - We have been creating our very own non-fiction text based on our Rainforest animal hybrid. We have been thinking about what our animal looks like, what they eat and where they live. In Maths, we have been using column subtraction with exchanging to solve some tricky problems. In CCL, we have been locating the counties, capital cities and famous landmarks of South America onto a map. In R.E, we have been discussing how light is important to many religions. We have been comparing the similarities and differences of celebrations for different religions and how light is used in these celebrations.

Year 5 - This week, we have been enjoying writing descriptive poetry and we have become extremely passionate poets. In Maths, we have been learning how to estimate to check our answers. In Science, we described the changes that humans go through as they develop to old age.

Year 6 - In Maths this week, we have continued to develop our understanding of fractions and focused on mixed number and improper fractions. We were excited to retell the story of Darwin's Dragons in our English lessons and have worked extremely hard to use a range of descriptive techniques such as figurative language and powerful verbs. In Science this week, we learnt about the life of Charles Darwin and created a comic strip about his fascinating life!
