

## Reception Newsletter

Friday 7<sup>th</sup> January 2022

Dear Parents/Carers,

HAPPY NEW YEAR! We hope you all had an enjoyable Christmas break. The children have shared their experiences of their Christmas and New Year celebrations with great excitement.

In Literacy this week, we have recapped the sounds and tricky words learnt so far and learnt how words change when the 's' is added to the end of them. The children have learnt the tricky words we, me and be. There are more new sounds to come next week - keep an eye out for these in your child's sound book. We have also been reading with the children and checking each child's progress within the school reading scheme. When reading at home, please encourage your child to hold the book, tracking the words as they read them using their index finger. As the pictures help to tell the story, make sure you talk about the pictures and text as you read through the book. We recommend children re-read their books to develop their fluency, pleasure and independence. Please make a comment in the reading diary book to show you have read the book at home.

In Numeracy this week, we have focused on comparing numbers to 5. We have counted out different amounts of fruit and discussed more and less. We have addressed the misconception that the size of things doesn't mean more e.g. 'The pineapple is bigger and takes up more space on the plate but there are still more grapes because we can count 5 of them.' We have then looked at how numbers are made up of smaller numbers and looked at different ways of making 4 and 5 e.g. 2 and 2 make 4 and 1 and 3 make 4. We have recorded the calculations using the appropriate signs e.g.  $2+2=4$ . Next week in our maths sessions we will be exploring and comparing heavy and light objects. We will learn about the concept of weight and talk about using weighing scales to measure to help us find out which objects are lighter and which are heavier. To help with our learning next week, we would like the children to bring in 2 identical containers or tubs. One container filled with something light and one container filled with something heavy e.g. cotton wool and rice or pasta and flour etc. The children will use the containers to predict the heaviest and lightest objects and sort into heavy and light sets.

Currently parents and carers are able to collect pupils at the end of the school day in the playground – in order for this to continue, but to reduce the numbers of people on site, please can we request that once children have been collected that you leave the school premises as quickly as possible. We would very much appreciate your support with this. Thank you.

In our topic work this week, we have enjoyed learning about New Year and what this means. We have talked about making a 'new year wish' which they will be able to talk to you about in this week's 'Talking Topic':
