Welcome back!



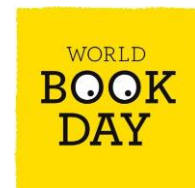
In English, we have been learning about Captain Robert Falcon Scott and the part he played in the race to reach the South Pole first. Next week, we will be writing a diary entry from the perspective of Captain Robert Falcon Scott.

This week in Phonics, we have reviewed some of the sounds we have been finding tricky: ui as in fruit, ou as in group, oe as in toe and ou as in shoulder. Our tricky words for the week have been: water, want, many, any and again. These are the words the children need to be able to sight read.

This week in Maths, we have been sharing amounts and linking this to dividing by 2. Next week, we will begin a new unit on fractions. We will be finding half of objects and amounts.

In CCL, we have been focusing on the DT element of this topic and begun stitching flags. Using Binca and thread, the children have used a running stitch to create their flag. Next week, the children begin to evaluate their flags; what went well and what they found tricky.

On Thursday, it was World Book Day. The children celebrated this by bringing in their favourite book from home. We enjoyed sharing stories with each other. We would also like to say a huge well done to all the children who completed some of the World Book Day challenges. We were very impressed with these entries.



Please could we remind parents to ensure that reading bags are not being used to carry water bottles into school. The reading packets are specifically designed to be waterproof so any water-bottles that accidentally open do not completely soak whatever is inside the packet.
