


Dear Parent / Carer,

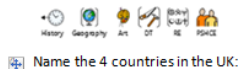
This week in Phonics, our sounds have been 'ch' as in school, 'ch' as in chef and 'ze' as in freeze. Our tricky words for the week have been: laugh, because, eye, our, once and thought. These are the words the children need to be able to sight read.

In Maths, we have been using the language tens and ones to describe two-digit numbers. Using sticks and bricks, the children have built these numbers to allow them to see how each digit in a two-digit number represents a different value.

Number	Tens and ones	Base 10
26	2 tens 6 ones	

After the holidays, we will continue to explore numbers within 100 and compare them using the inequality symbols.

In CCL lessons, we have been completing a quiz about all of the facts we have learnt so far this year. We are really pleased with how this important knowledge is 'sticking' in the children's memories.
