




# Plants – Year 2



**Plants can grow from seeds or bulbs -**



<b>seeds</b>	<b>bulbs</b>
	

**Seeds and bulbs germinate and grow into seedlings**




**Seedlings then grow into mature plants**


Key vocabulary	
<b>seed</b>	Part of a flowering plant that grows into a new plant.
<b>bulb</b>	A root shaped like an onion that grows into a new plant.
<b>germinate</b>	When a seed begins to grow its shoots. Seeds need warmth and water to germinate.
<b>seedling</b>	A young plant that has grown from a seed.
<b>bud</b>	Growth on a plant that develops into a stem, leaf or shoot.
<b>flower</b>	The part of a plant which is often brightly coloured and grows at the end of a stem.
<b>fruit</b>	Fleshy part of a plant that contains seeds or a stone.
<b>berry</b>	Small, juicy fruit without a stone.
<b>root</b>	The part of the plant that grows under the ground.

Significant scientist	
<p><b>David Douglas</b> (1799-1834)</p> 	<p>David Douglas was a Scottish botanist, best known as the namesake of the Douglas-fir. He worked as a gardener, and explored the Scottish Highlands, North America, and Hawaii.</p>
