

seed	Part of a flowering plant that
	grows into a new plant.
bulb	A root shaped like an onion
	that grows into a new plant.
germinate	When a seed begins to grow
	its shoots. Seeds need
	warmth and water to
	germinate.
seedling	A young plant that has grown
	from a seed.
bud	Growth on a plant that
	develops into a stem, leaf or
	shoot.
flower	The part of a plant which is
	often brightly coloured and
	grows at the end of a stem.
fruit	Fleshy part of a plant that
	contains seeds or a stone.
berry	Small, juicy fruit without a
	stone.
root	The part of the plant that
	grows under the ground.
