In English, we have written a diary entry from the perspective of Captain Robert Falcon Scott. Using knowledge, the children had obtained in History, they were able to recall lots of key facts from Captain Scott's expedition and the treacherous conditions that he and his team faced.

This week in Phonics, our sounds have been 'al' as in half, 'tch' as in match and 'ture' as in adventure. Our tricky words for the week have been: eye and because. These are the words the children need to be able to sight read.

This week in Maths, we have been doubling numbers. We have looked at many different representations of doubles:

$$\textit{three add three} = \underline{\quad}$$

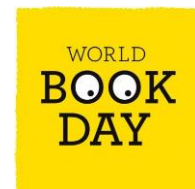
$$\textit{double 8} = \underline{\quad}$$

Next week, we will be sharing and finding halves of numbers and then linking this to division.

In CCL, we have been focusing on the DT element of this topic and begun stitching flags. Using Binca and thread, the children have used running stitch to create their flag. During our Open Door sessions next week, the children are excited to continue stitching their flag, with their grown up.

On Thursday, it was World Book Day. The children celebrated this by dressing up and bringing in their favourite book from home. We had a great day sharing stories with each other. We would like to say a huge well done to all the children who completed the 'Book in a Box' challenge. We were very impressed with these entries.
