

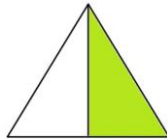

Dear Parent / Carer,

In English, we have explored the poem "Colour" by Christina Rossetti. Next week, we are going to write our own version of the poem choosing different items to represent the colours mentioned in the poem.

This week in Phonics, our sounds have been 'ear' as in learn, 'st' as in listen, 'sc' as in scent and 'wr' as in wrong. Our tricky words for the week have been: many, any, two, friend, through and your. These are the words the children need to be able to sight read.

In Maths, we have been finding half of shapes and objects. The children were quick to notice two equal parts always make a whole. Using 2D shapes, we discussed how some shapes can only be split in one way (e.g a triangle) where as others can be halved in multiple ways (e.g a rectangle). Next week, we will be finding a quarter of shapes.
