

In English this week, we started a new unit of work based on non-chronological reports. At the beginning of the week, we discussed the key features of non-fiction texts and identified them in a report about polar bears.



After that, we watched a video to learn about the Portia Spider and started to plan a non-chronological report. We will write our reports next week.

In Maths, we have been ordering numbers from 0-1000 on number lines and completed a place value assessment as we move towards our next area of focus, addition and subtraction. Next week, we will be adding hundreds.

In Geography, we looked at two different types of volcanoes (composite volcano and shield volcano) and labelled their features. We then researched the definition of an active, dormant and extinct volcano and located examples of each on the world map.



In our RE lesson, we listened to some stories about Moses and discussed why he is a key figure in Judaism. We recapped on the Ten Commandments and thought about how these link to rules and laws in society today.
