Reception Newsletter

Dear Parents/Carers,

In Literacy this week, we have been recapping the phase 2 sounds **i**, **n**, **d**, **g** and **c** and practised blending the sounds together to read words. We have also been practising reading the Phase 2 tricky words **is**, **I** and **the**. We have been forming the letters **c** and **k**. Please keep practising these sounds with your child at home, little and often is usually the best! Next week, we will be learning the sounds **ff**, **II**, **ss** and **j** and will be forming the letter **e** and the digraph **ck**. We will be learning the new tricky word '**as**.' Please keep sharing your child's reading book at home and sign next to the book title in their reading diary with a comment of how they have done with their reading book at home. We will aim to change the reading scheme books once a week. Please ensure that your child's reading book comes back to school each day in their reading packet as this book is also used to listen to your child read at school throughout the week.

This week in Numeracy, we have been exploring simple pattens and developed our understanding and concept of the word pattern. We have been learning that a pattern is a repeated unit and can be both visual and auditory. We have been busy making our own repeating patterns using objects and encouraged the children to join in with repeated patterns in sound patterns and rhymes and we noticed the patterns in stories where words were repeated. You could encourage your child to point out any repeating patterns in their home or when out and about in the environment. Next week we will be exploring different representations of 1, 2 and 3.

In topic we have enjoyed learning all about Bonfire night. We enjoyed discussing what Bonfire night means and why some people celebrate Bonfire night. We created our own firework paintings with exciting colours and glitter and wrote the sounds that the fireworks made! Next week, we will be learning all about the celebration of Diwali. If you celebrate Diwali and would like to share your experiences and photographs with us then please let us know via your child's home/school book as we would love to show them to the Reception children and share your celebrations with the class.

This week's 'Talking Topic' is: I can tell you all about Bonfire Night and why some people celebrate this day.

Following on from our learning during maths, this week's word of the week is: Pattern

This week's class reader: Sparks in the Sky
