In Science last week, the children lead an investigation to find out if a range of everyday materials are magnetic or not magnetic. This week, we used the same materials to test if the magnetic objects could attract through a material (water). As an extension, we discussed what might happen if the magnetic materials were heavier.

We completed our History unit of work 'Would you prefer to live in the Stone Age, Bronze Age or Iron Age?' by comparing settlements in the Stone Age to the Iron Age and thinking about the similarities and differences between the two.

Next week, we will be moving on to our new Geography topic 'Who lives in Antarctica?'.
