Dear Parents/Carers.

What a fun week it has been: parties, Christmas jumper day and remembering the true meaning of Christmas in our Carol Service at St John's church. You should have received feedback on next steps in your child's maths learning. Please keep practising these next steps in order for your child to become secure with their maths learning. This week in our maths sessions, we have introduced the children to one more and one less working with numbers up to 5. We practised counting forwards and we noticed that the numbers increased in size when one more was added. The children then began to understand that as we count back, each number is one less than the number before. The children then noticed that the numbers get smaller because they are taking one away. We asked the children different mathematical questions such as 'How many are there now?' 'What is one less/more than?' 'What is the number before/after?'



This week we have been practising forming the letters 'u' and 'y' and worked very hard to ensure that our letters sit on the line and formed correctly using the letter formation phrase to help them.

Thank you to everyone who is regularly logging into your child's Learning Journey via Seesaw and we hope you are enjoying seeing your child's progress, new learning and next steps at school so far.
