In English this week, we have had an 'eggciting' discovery. The pupils arrived on Monday to find that some colourful eggs have been laid in the classrooms. We have all been thinking what could have laid them? When did it happen? Who might have witnessed this happen? Why at our school? This excitement resulted in some detailed report writing and the pupils got the chance to interview each other and write their opinions on this interesting story. Let's see what happens with the eggs next week!

In Maths, we started to focus on length. We learnt first of all that length means "how far it is from one end to the other" then thought about which tool was the most appropriate to use when measuring different objects – a 15cm ruler, a 30cm ruler, a metre stick or a measuring tape. This encouraged the children to work out whether the measurements needed to be in millimetres, centimetres or metres. Following this, we estimated how long or tall we thought an object would be, before measuring them accurately.

Finally, we found fractions of lengths, then added and subtracted lengths to and from each other.
