Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back and we hope you have had a very enjoyable Easter holiday.

In Literacy this week, we have started our Phase 4 phonics learning which focuses on consolidating and practising the letter sounds learnt so far. We do not introduce any new sounds throughout this phase. During phase 4 the children will begin to recognise how the sounds they have already learned are often blended together into clusters. The children will be learning how to read and spell words which have adjacent consonants, such as 'trap,' 'string,' and 'milk.' We now have more new tricky words to learn and this week we have been reading our new tricky words; said, so, have and like. Please keep practising these with your child at home. The phase 4 tricky word list will be added into your child's tricky word box. Next week we are focusing on sentence writing and becoming more independent at hearing all of the sounds in words. This week in our handwriting sessions, we have be practising forming the capital letters **B** and **P**.






From the top, down, back to the top. Round to the middle, round to the bottom.

From the top, down then back up. Curve right to halfway down.

In Numeracy we have started learning about taking away amounts. The children already have experience of taking away objects in everyday life and this is now built on by taking away more than one object. This week's focus has been on decreasing a quantity by a given amount, while continuing to work within 10. We worked together by using real objects to see that the quantity of a group can be changed by taking some away. The children were encouraged to remove the items and then count or subitise to see how many are left. The 'first, then, now' structure is an effective way to help build their understanding by creating mathematical stories in meaningful contexts, using tens frames, number tracks and their fingers. The children were asked key questions such as 'How many are there?' 'How many were there first?' 'How many are left?' 'How many are there now?'





In topic work, we have been learning all about Eid. We have looked at different clothes that are worn, found out lots of new information around why Eid is celebrated and created our own Mehndi patterns.

I can tell you all about Eid!




