In Literacy this week, we have been reading root words with the 'er' and 'est' sounds such as jumper and strongest etc. and have used the chunking method as needed to help us to read longer words. We have also been focusing on developing our reading fluency. We have been working on the children's next steps and practised being as fluent as possible. Please keep practising at home and writing comments in the reading diary so that we can continue this support at school.

In Numeracy, we have been focusing on forming our numbers correctly, remembering the number formation rhymes to help us when needed. The children enjoyed writing their numbers as far as they could go.

As part of our Enquiry Learning this week, we have been enjoying writing a recount of our school trip to Ponderosa. We used our photographs to order the day and wrote about our favourite parts in the correct sequence.
